# LOOP Talks 2023: Collecting video as a path to innovation

The LOOP Talks are a series of roundtable discussions, one-to-one conversations and professional gatherings exploring artists' film and video. By bringing together international art experts, these 2-day marathons look into analysing the modes of film practices both formally and conceptually, putting forth questions on how the moving image is produced, perceived and circulated within and outside the gallery space.

LOOP Talks is pleased to present a set of conversations amongst practitioners and professionals to shed light around the role of moving image nowadays. This year we host a wide array of views, ways of doing and terms of engagement that take into account: the specificity of the medium, the challenges that digital culture and its fast-developing technical capabilities present, and the attitude that collecting and collectors need to embrace now.

We are pleased to stage a tribute to Guada Echevarría, who passed away this year and founded the legendary San Sebastian Video Festival. At the same time, the talks will pay special attention to the question of how the connection between the work and the collector informs a path towards collecting.
